





- 2 August 1967: A-4C (149632) of VA-55; pilot recovered.
- 8 August 1967: A-4C (147719) of VA-146; pilot recovered.
- 17 August 1967: RA-5C (149302) of RVAH-12; both crew members killed (CDR Dion, LTJG Hom).
- 3 November 1967: KA-3B (147653) of VAH-8: all three crew members killed.




